

ANNUAL MENOMINEE TRIBAL SCHOLARSHIP 2025-2026 ACADEMIC YEAR

Deadline to apply: May 30, 2025 @ 4:30 PM

Attention students: The Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin will be awarding four (4) \$1,500 scholarships for the upcoming school year. Scholarships will be made payable to the college/university in the amount of \$750/semester.

One \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded to a Menominee student in each the following categories:

- 1. Graduating high school senior
- 2. Vocational/Technical College student enrolled in a 1 or 2-year program
- 3. Undergraduate student enrolled at a 4-year college/university
- 4. Graduate student pursuing a masters or doctorate degree

REQUIRED INFORMATION

Completed scholarship application
High School Seniors & New Students: Letter of acceptance from the college/university and high school
transcript. Continuing Students: Submit most recent unofficial transcript from college/university
Two letters of Recommendation: Letters can be from a teacher, advisor, employer or other professional
familiar with your academic potential. No family or relative letters of support.
Essay : 1-2 page typed essay. This is your chance to share your story: your challenges, opportunities, goals,
giving readers an opportunity to see how your education will influence you and your community. Include any
extracurricular activities and community service.
Proof of Menominee enrollment : Copy of tribal ID card, certificate, or signed certification on application.

SCORING

Members of the award committee will be leaders from the tribal community. Applications will be scored based upon:

- ✓ Transcript: Up to 15 points Cumulative GPA: 4.00-3.50/15 points; 3.49-3.00/10 points; 2.99-2.00/5 points.
- ✓ Letters of Recommendation: Up to 10 points
- ✓ Essay: Up to 25 points

AWARDING OF SCHOLARSHIPS

- Students who receive the highest scores will receive the awards. Note: The quality and content of the essay, as well as academic achievement, will have a strong bearing on the total score.
- Scholarship recipients will be notified within a week after the committee reviews and scores the applications.
- Fall award: The first half of the scholarship will be sent to the school upon receipt of the student's fall semester schedule, showing <u>full-time</u> enrollment. Student must maintain full-time status.
- Spring award: The second half of the scholarship will be sent to the school upon receipt of fall grade report and spring schedule showing <u>full-time</u> enrollment. Fall grades must show satisfactory academic progress (2.0 GPA or better). If you will not be attending the spring semester, please notify our office.

NOTE: Students can receive a scholarship award one time in each category.
